# **Title**

Do not use "Duckietown Engineering" or "Duckietown" in the title of the file - that's redundant.

Temporary (long story): Put the bird pat the end of the title.

### Header

Do use the mascot Mack, as above.

# **Table of contents**

Use Insert > Table of Contents. Refresh every once in a while.

### "Please"

✓ Do not use "please" in technical documentation. 

□Please do not use "please" in technical documentation.

### **Command line**

Use either "laptop" or "duckiebot" as the prefix for the command line, in bold.

Use Consolas as the font, not Courier New.

✓ laptop \$ cd ~/duckietown

### Vehicle name

Use \${VEHICLE\_NAME} in orange to signify the vehicle name.

This makes it also easier to copy and paste the command lines.

```
□laptop $ ssh veh_name.local

✓ laptop $ ssh ${VEHICLE_NAME}.local
✓ duckiebot $ roslaunch duckietown joystick.launch
veh:=${VEHICLE_NAME}
```

Use <VEHICLE\_NAME> when it should appear in the output of a command.

```
□laptop $ rostopic list | grep image_rect
□/veh_name/camera_node/image_rect

✓ laptop $ rostopic list | grep image_rect
✓ /<VEHICLE_NAME>/camera_node/image_rect
```
